

Marshall's Notes

- 1 Please get your group to all put their bags to the correct side of the greens.
- 2 Putting out, be lining up your putts whilst others are putting out.
- 3 Do not mark your cards on the green, clear the green as soon as possible.
- 4 If you are waiting on a tee, make sure you all have your clubs out ready to go.
- 5 In a perfect world, whoever has the honour would go first in competitions.
If you are not playing in a competition and are ready to go, tee off hence the term (ready golf).
- 6 If you think there is a possibility that you, or one of your party might have trouble finding their tee shot, then play a provisional. There is NO returning to the tee under any circumstances.
Failure to comply, will result in a 2 shot penalty and if playing in a competition, the loss of the hole.
If you are not playing in a competition and are ready to go, tee off hence the term (ready golf).
If you think you may have trouble finding your ball from a fairway i.e. your 3rd or 4th shots, please play a provisional ball!!
- 7 If you are searching for a lost ball the maximum time taken should be no longer than 3 minutes.
- 8 If you can call the group behind through please do so.
- 9 You should never lose sight of the group in front of you i.e. be more than 1 hole behind,
if you are, your 4 ball is playing too slowly, speed them up.
- 10 As we could be playing as 12 x four balls there is no excuse. Remember that we could have another society behind us so any unnecessary delays have a huge impact on everybody behind us.
- 11 Finally, the only way we can work out where delays are taking place on society days, is to monitor every 4 ball.
There might well be a legitimate reason why a delay has occurred.
It is the marshalls responsibility to log the start and finish time on their own card in the area provided.
Please do not forget.
- 12 Should there be any major delays out on the course the Marshalls will gather back together in the club house for a quick overview and future recommendations.
